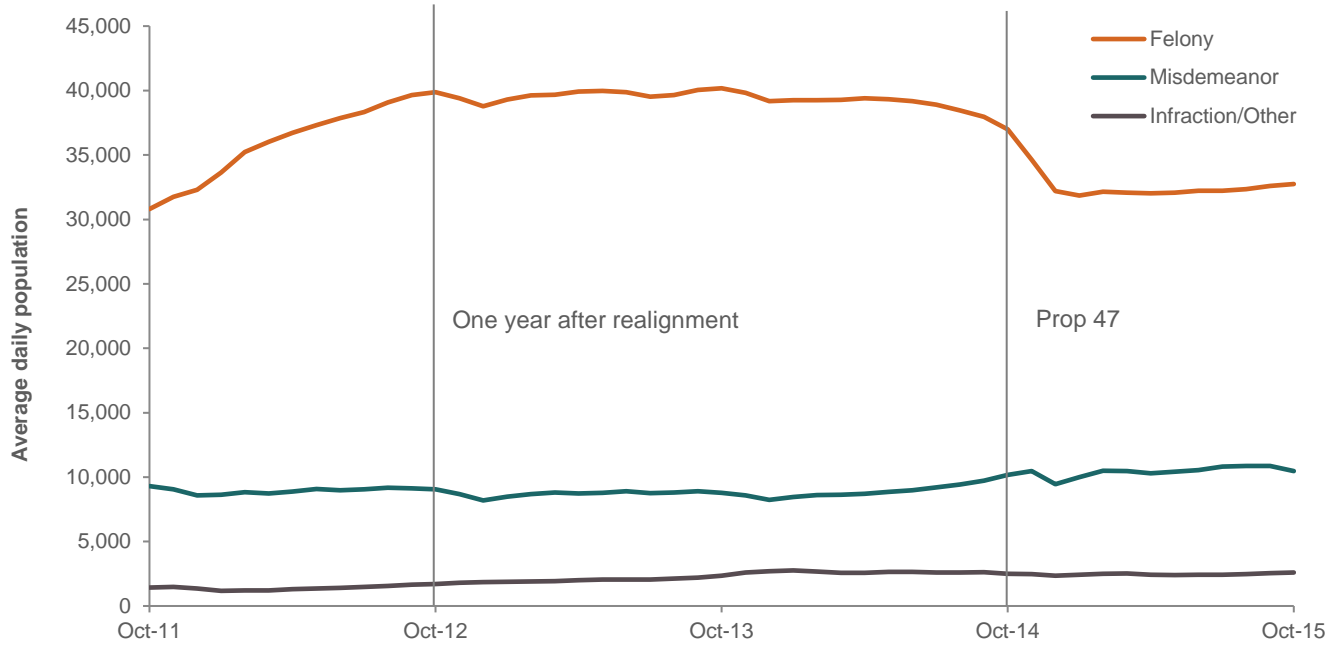

The number of people held on felony offenses increased and declined notably under realignment and Prop 47

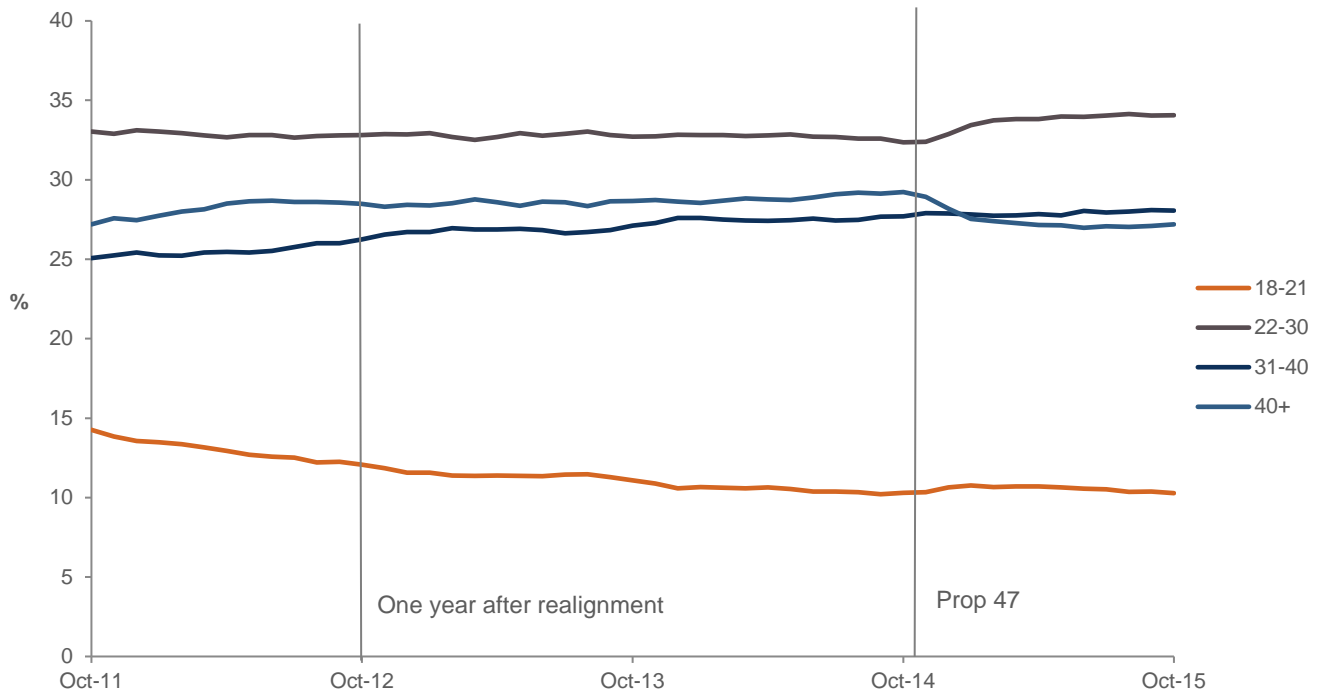
