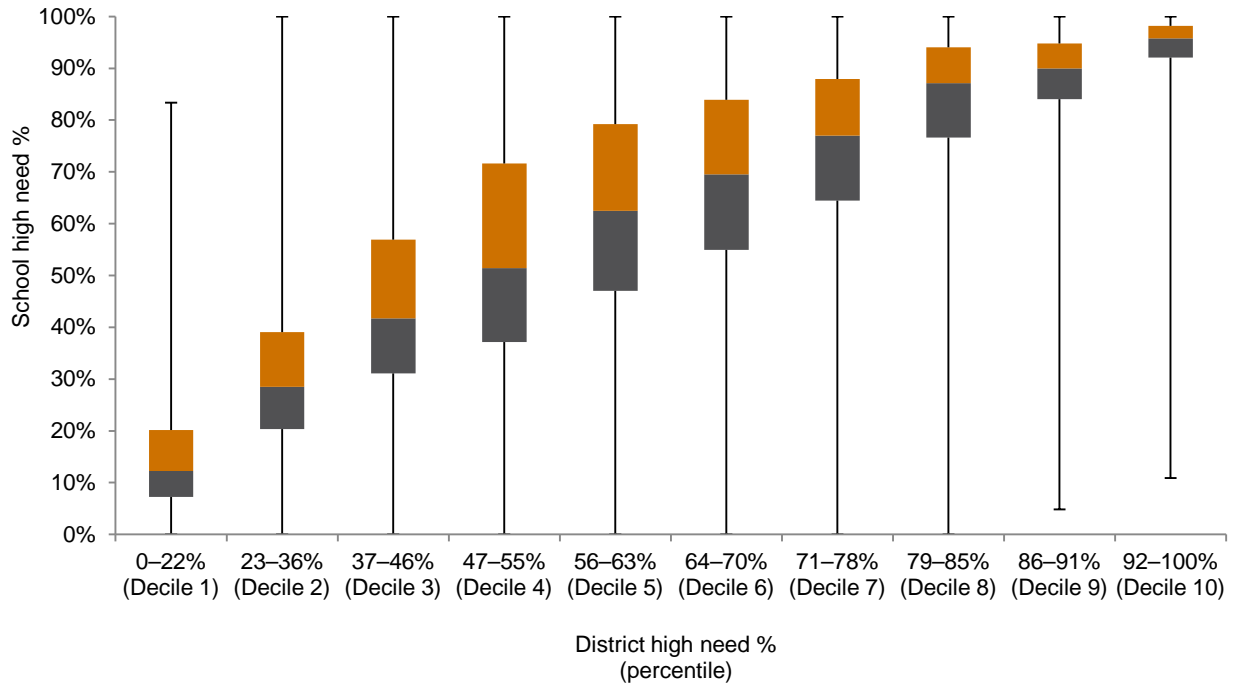
Appendix A

In order to examine the extent to which school shares of high-need students vary relative to their district concentrations, we group approximately 950 school districts¹ by their share of high-need students, arraying them into ten categories of equal size, starting with the districts with the lowest percentages of high-need students and ending with districts with the highest percentages. The first decile (the first box-and-whisker plot in Figure A1) shows the districts below the 10th percentile that have high-need percentages between 0 percent and 22 percent and the last decile shows districts between the 90th and 99th percentile that have high-need percentages between 92% and 100%). We then examine the shares of high-need students at each school for districts in this range. The percentage of high-need students at the median school decile of districts is found where the blue and green boxes meet. Figure A1 illustrates that, on average, as the district share of high-need students increases, so too does the share at the median school.

However, each district grouping reveals variation that is not evident if we just examine means or medians. The tails extending above and below each box depicts the range of the share of high-need students at schools within the district group. The top of the box illustrates the share of high-need students at the 75th percentile school and the bottom of the box illustrates the share of high-need students at the 25th percentile school. Recall that statewide, 63 percent of students are high-need. If we examine districts in which 63 percent to 70 percent of students are high-need, for example, we see that there are many schools with much higher and lower shares of high-need students, ranging from 55 percent to 84 percent of students between the 25th and 75th percentiles (as depicted in the bottom of the green box and the top of the blue box). With the exception of districts in the lowest and two highest deciles, all other deciles contained schools with as few as 0 and as many as 100 percent of students are high-need. When we eliminated schools with fewer than 100 students, we find many fewer districts with schools at the extremes (0% or 100% of students being high-need).

¹ “Non-regular” districts and schools are dropped for the remainder of the analysis. Specifically, county offices of education schools, non-school locations, State Board of Education and Statewide Benefit Charter schools, Juvenile Court schools, Youth Authority facilities, district office and nonpublic/nonsectarian schools. These reductions slightly shrink the sample from 10,356 schools in 1,025 districts serving 6,236,506 students to 9,598 schools in 949 districts with 6,122,558 students.
