

# Californians and Their Government—February 2022

## Full Crosstabs – Likely Voters Only

### Methodology Note:

Findings are based on a survey of 1,640 California adult residents, with 77 percent interviewed on cell phone (1,266 interviews) and 23 percent interviewed on landline telephones (374 interviews). Live landline and cell phone interviews were conducted in English and Spanish according to the respondents' preferences. The sample included 585 respondents reached by calling back respondents who had previously completed an interview in PPIC Statewide Surveys in the last six months. Interviews took an average of 19 minutes to complete. Interviewing took place on weekdays and weekday nights from January 16–25, 2022.

These crosstabs are based on a subgroup of 1,048 California adult likely voters. The sampling error, taking design effects from weighting into consideration, is  $\pm 4.6$  percent at the 95 percent confidence level for the unweighted sample of 1,048 likely voters. The sampling error for unweighted likely voter subgroups is larger. Sampling error is only one type of error to which surveys are subject. Results may also be affected by factors such as question wording, question order, and survey timing.
