

# Californians and Their Economic Well-Being—December 2020

## Full Crosstabs – California Adults Earning Less Than \$40,000 Only

### Methodology Note:

Findings are based on a survey of 2,325 California adult residents, conducted online using the Ipsos KnowledgePanel. Interviews were conducted in English, Spanish, Chinese (simplified or traditional), Vietnamese, and Korean according to the respondents' preferences. The median time to complete the survey was 14.4 minutes. Interviewing took place from November 4–23, 2020.

These crosstabs are based on a subgroup of 1,001 California adults earning less than \$40,000 annually. The sampling error, taking design effects from weighting into consideration, is  $\pm 5$  percent at the 95 percent confidence level for the unweighted sample of 1,001 California adults earning less than \$40,000 annually. The sampling error for unweighted lower income subgroups is larger. Sampling error is only one type of error to which surveys are subject. Results may also be affected by factors such as question wording, question order, and survey timing.
