

# Californians and Their Government—September 2017

## Full Crosstabs – Likely Voters Only

### Methodology Note:

Findings are based on a survey of 1,734 California adult residents, with 63 percent interviewed on cell phones (1,095 interviews) and 37 percent interviewed on landline telephones (639 interviews). Live landline and cell phone interviews were conducted in English and Spanish according to the respondents' preferences. Interviews took an average of 20 minutes to complete. Interviewing took place on weekend days and weekday nights September 10–19, 2017.

These crosstabs are based on a subgroup of 1,103 California adult likely voters. The sampling error, taking design effects from weighting into consideration, is  $\pm 3.8$  percent at the 95 percent confidence level for the unweighted sample of 1,103 likely voters. The sampling error for unweighted likely voter subgroups is larger. Sampling error is only one type of error to which surveys are subject. Results may also be affected by factors such as question wording, question order, and survey timing.
