

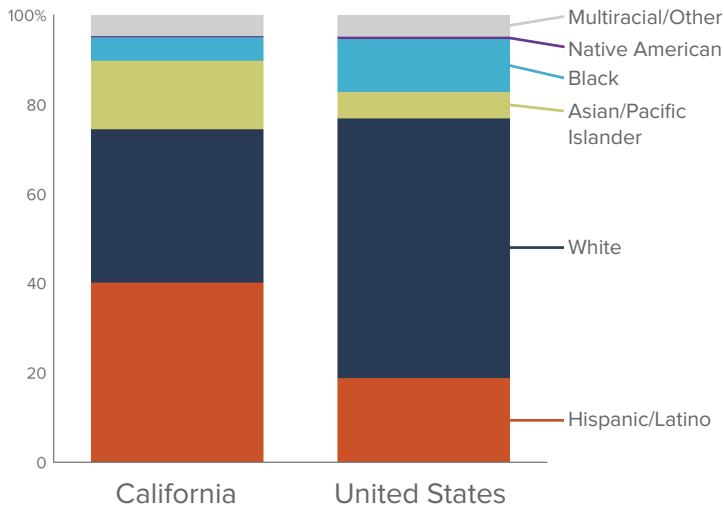


Race and Diversity in the Golden State



California's diversity is one of the state's greatest assets. What are the numbers behind it?

California has higher percentages of Latinos and Asians than the US as a whole



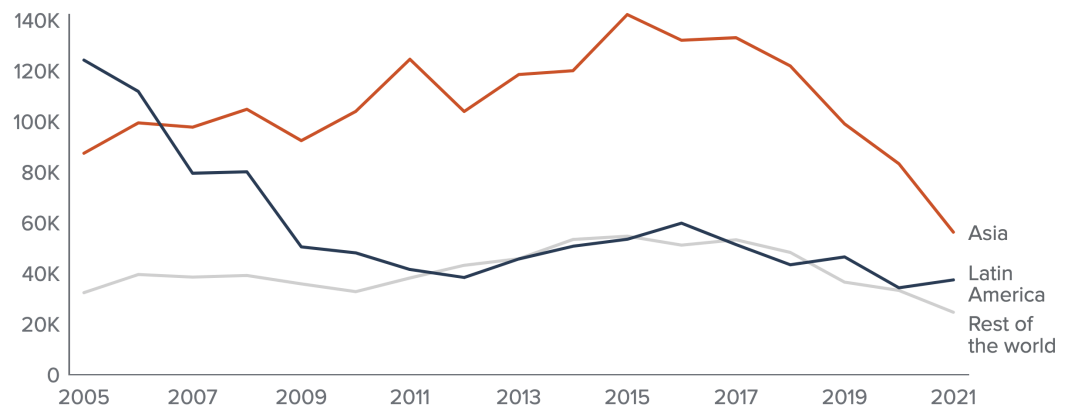
- 23%** of immigrants in the United States live in California
- 46%** of California children have at least one immigrant parent
- 53%** of California state legislators are non-white, up from 13% in 1990

Persisting disparities

- Annual income
- Home-ownership
- College completion
- Voter registration

Asia remains the leading source of recent immigrants to California, though levels have declined recently
