Time Trends – Likely Voters

Methodology Note:

Findings for April 2020 are based on a survey of 1,633 California adult residents, conducted online using the Ipsos KnowledgePanel. Interviews were conducted in English and Spanish according to the respondents' preferences. The median time to complete the survey was 18.5 minutes. Interviews were conducted from April 1–9, 2020.

The April 2020 sampling error for the 1,091 likely voters, taking design effects from weighting into consideration, is ± 3.7 percent. Sampling error is only one type of error to which surveys are subject. Results may also be affected by factors such as question wording, question order, and survey timing.
