Californians and Their Government September 2023 Time Trends – Likely Voters

Methodology Note:

Findings for September 2023 are based on a survey of 1,671 California adult residents, conducted online using the Ipsos KnowledgePanel. Interviews were conducted in English and Spanish according to the respondents' preferences. The median time to complete the survey was 20 minutes. Interviewing took place from August 25–September 5, 2023.

The September 2023 sampling error for the 1,146 likely voters, taking design effects from weighting into consideration, is ± 3.7 percent. Sampling error is only one type of error to which surveys are subject. Results may also be affected by factors such as question wording, question order, and survey timing.
