Californians and Their Economic Well-Being November 2023 Time Trends – Likely Voters

Methodology Note:

Findings for November 2023 are based on a survey of 2,250 California adult residents, conducted online using the Ipsos KnowledgePanel. Interviews were conducted in English, Spanish, Chinese (simplified or traditional), Vietnamese, and Korean according to the respondents' preferences. The median time to complete the survey was 19 minutes. Interviewing took place from October 3–19, 2023.

The November 2023 sampling error for the 1,395 likely voters, taking design effects from weighting into consideration, is ± 4 percent. Sampling error is only one type of error to which surveys are subject. Results may also be affected by factors such as question wording, question order, and survey timing.
